


Web Fonts Extension for ADOBE PHOTOSHOP

This product was born out of the creative challenge of integrating and designing with Web fonts in your creative process. Having the right fonts available is both critical and a time saver for your creative workflow. You will no longer need to spend countless hours creating various resolutions of text images or resorting to those dreaded, uninspiring Web safe fonts when designing proofs and prototypes.



THE FONTS.COM WEB FONTS EXTENSION FOR ADOBE® PHOTOSHOP® enables users to easily design and preview their creative prototypes and proofs using the best selection of Web fonts. The intent and purpose of the extension is to make the creative design and prototype workflow easier and thus, the Web fonts **MAY NOT** be used for production content, only client proofs and prototypes. To enable the Web fonts in your proofs and prototypes for production, simply publish your project from your account on Fonts.com.

The extension automatically syncs with your projects on Fonts.com and enables you to create new projects directly within the extension or on the portal. With the extension, you can even take your Photoshop workflow offline!

Launch Extension Manager

- To view your list of applications:
 - For Macs:** Finder ▷ Applications (Figure 1)
 - For Windows:** Start Menu ▷ All Programs
- Locate and launch the Adobe Extension Manager (Figure 1). If you have more than one version of Photoshop installed, be sure to select the corresponding Extension Manager that you would like to have the Web fonts extension installed.



Installation

- Once the Adobe Extension Manager has loaded, select Photoshop. Click on ▷ **Install** at the top of the Extension Manager.



Load Extension

- Navigate to the location where you unzipped your Web Fonts Extension. Find and select the **Webfonts.xzp** file.



Disclaimer

1: Click **Accept** to continue (Figure 4).



Extension Manager

1: Once the installation is complete, you will see the Web fonts extension listed in the Extension Manager (Figure 5).



Web Fonts Extension Location

1: Your installed Web fonts extension can now be accessed in the **Window** menu under **Extensions** (Figure 6).



Log In Panel

1: You will need to have a Fonts.com account to **log in** to the Web fonts extension (Figure 7). Use the **Email** and **Password** that you have registered your Fonts.com account with.

If you do not have a Fonts.com account, click on **Need to Register?**.

2: Upon a successful log in to your account, the extension will configure itself and **sync** with the projects that you have created in your Fonts.com Web fonts account (Figure 8).

Sync time will be dependent on the number of projects in your account.





Registration Panel

1: To create a **Fonts.com Web fonts account** via the extension (Figure 9), enter your **Firstname**, **Lastname** and **Email** address.

2: You will receive an email with further instructions. Once you have created your account and have changed your password, click **Return to Login** to log in.



Projects Tab

1: To create a new project, delete a project or manage existing projects, select the **manage** button below the font display pane (Figure 10).

To access the token for the project, select the **token** button (Figure 10). The token enables you to use the Web font portal's "Import Project" feature to create a project with the fonts in your extension project (Figure 11).





My Projects Panel

1: To create a new project, enter the new project name in the **display box** and click on **create**. Here we are creating a project called AachenLove (Figure 12).

2: This is the **my projects** panel, where you can manage your projects (Figure 13).

Select a project to **rename** it or to access its **token**. You can also select multiple projects to **delete** them.





Fonts Tab

1: Select your **Project** (Figure 14).

2: Go to the **Fonts** tab to add fonts to your project (Figure 15).

The **Fonts** panel enables you to browse the Web font library.

Use the **scroll bar** and **page controls** to navigate. The fonts that you see represent font families.

3: Type a keyword into the **text box** and click **search** to find a font family containing that keyword or click **filters** to use filters to narrow your results (Figure 15).





Adding Font Families

1: Click on **+** to add the entire font family to a project (Figure 16).

NOTE: Adding an entire font family to your project will include all the font styles and weights in the family. Depending on the size of the family, this step may take a few minutes to complete.



Font Family Info

1: Click on the **i** (Figure 17) to learn more about the font family (Figure 18).





Viewing Fonts

1: Click on **>>** (Figure 19) to see the individual fonts in the family (Figure 20).

To add a specific font to your project, select the font and click **>+** (Figure 19).



Applying Fonts

1: To **apply a font** to a text layer, be sure that the text layer in your Photoshop file is selected and double-click the desired font (Figure 21/22/23).

If the font has been added to one of your projects, it will be available for access even when you are using the extension in an offline state. **NOTE:** To operate the Web fonts extension offline, you must be logged in to your extension prior to going offline.

2: If you apply a font to your selected text layer from the **Font Library**, remember to add it to your **Project** to make sure that it is saved (Figure 24).







Filter Tool

- 1: You can also use our **filter tool** in the font gallery to quickly browse to the style of typefaces you are looking for (Figure 25). The filters in the Web fonts extension are identical to the filters available on the Fonts.com Web fonts site.
- 2: In this example, we are using the **Classification** filter (Figure 25) to select the **Handwriting** category (Figure 26) of typefaces.





Settings Panel

- 1: The **settings panel** allows you to personalize the Web fonts extension (Figure 27).

The **Sync every hour** drop down (Figure 27) enables you to select how often you would like the Web fonts extension to sync with your Fonts.com Web fonts account. A sync process will update the changes that have been made in the Web fonts extension and in your online account since the last sync process.





Font History Panel

- 1: The **font history** panel records the fonts that you have most recently applied.
- 2: You can also add the fonts listed here to your projects (Figure 29/30).
